What is 4-H?

4-H is a very special club for boys and girls in grades K-12. 4-H can help you learn how to make and do many things; and best of all, you can choose things that you would like to do! 4H will help you feel good about yourself.

What will I do in 4-H?

- 4-H members form clubs of about five members or more with an adult as their leader. Club members elect their own officers and make decisions with the help of their leader. Clubs may have dues if that is what members decide. Some dubs have moneymaking projects.
- 4-H members have regular meetings (about six or more a year). The meetings are usually in members' homes. Each meeting has a planned program with activities, demonstrations, field trips, and refreshments.
- 4-H members choose projects from a list. They can choose any project they think they would like to do. 4H project books tell members what they need to do for each project. Part of the cost of the books is paid through the \$8.00 county dues.
- 4-H members work on their projects during the year at home and at club meetings. They exhibit their finished projects at the Jackson County Fair in the summer. The projects are judged and members get ribbons to show how well they did.

How do I join 4-H?

4-H is easy to join! You can have your parents fill out the form on the next page and send it to the Extension Office or they can call Pam Hess at the office at 358-6101. The Extension Office will tell you what club is in your area. It costs \$8.00 to join 4-H, and your club may have dues. These costs are paid to your 4-H Leader at your first meeting.
